Scope of Work - General

- All work shall be conducted in a manner that assures the safety and health of employees and the public, is protective of the environment, safeguards classified information and protects special nuclear materials.

General Expectations include:

- Site-wide culture of continuous improvement
- Integrated Quality Assurance program
- Systems engineering and project management approach
- Tailored application of requirements
- Use of innovative technology and approaches
- Comprehensive contractor assurance system
- ISM and EMS integrated into management and work at all levels
- Disciplined process for managing Site interfaces



Scope of Work - General

General Expectations include:

- Enhancing external relationships
- Multi-year performance baseline
- Use of Earned Value Management System
- Effective use of competition to achieve best value
- Maintenance of critical skills and technical expertise
- Culture of scientific inquiry and technical inquisitiveness
- Plan strategically for changing budgets and technical and regulatory requirements

Performance Evaluation and Measurement Plan to be established post-award and will define expectations, incentives, measures, and evaluation process



Scope of Work Exceptions

- Liquid Waste (LW) Program
 - Operation of DWPF and DDA
 - Operation of ARP and MCU until SWPF is operational
 - Operation of SWPF and Saltstone (post turnover)
 - Operational closure of LW tanks and evaporator
 - Management and Surveillance
- Site security currently performed by Wackenhut Services Inc.
- Natural resource management activities (U. S. Forest Service)
- Ecological activities conducted by the Savannah River Ecology Lab
- Potential ID/IQ contracts for soil/water cleanup and D&D
- Potential DOE small business contracts to be awarded at a future date



Interfaces with Other Site Users

- Landlord services to be provided to DOE, NNSA, DOE/NNSA contractors, and tenant entities (and their subcontractors) as directed by CO
- M&O contractor provides such services as:
 - ISM oversight
 - Environmental permitting
 - Receipt of wastes
 - Utility services
 - Personnel Security
- Managing these interfaces will be key
